The city has been spraying for mosquitoes on a twice a week schedule when possible. There are some things that we should do that is more important than spraying when it comes to battling those pesky little biting bugs. I am referring to eliminating standing water around our homes. Gutters that need cleaned is a excellent place for mosquitoes to lay their eggs. Another place to check is for empty flower pots, buckets, etc. If you have a swimming pool that goes unused for more than a day there is a device that floats on the water and vibrates causing ripples in the water that discourages the mosquitoes from laying their eggs there. There is no way to eliminate mosquitoes, but an occasional walk around our homes looking for breeding places can go a long way toward making outdoor living much nicer.

Recycling is an important step in keeping our environment unpolluted. Let me remind you again to place your recycling in the tote loose and not in a plastic bag. If you put it in a plastic bag, you might as well put it in regular trash to go into a landfill. Plastic bags and plastic film clogs up the machinery at the recycling plant, causing a shut down while the plastic film is cleaned from the works. Some stores (Schnucks especially) have a collection box for plastic bags. The St. Johns Schnucks store has a wooden box located in the foyer by the carts for plastic bags. They have the proper equipment to process them.

ORDINANCE REMINDER

Chapter 345 Pedestrians' Rights and Duties #345.070 Pedestrians Walking Along Roadways.

- A) Where sidewalks are provided, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway.
- B) Where sidewalks are not provided, any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall when practicable, walk only on the left side of the roadway or its shoulder facing traffic which may approach from the opposite direction.

Notice of Public Hearing Publication Date July 6, 2023

The City of Edmundson will hold a public hearing to discuss the estimated allocation of \$40,000.00 in Community Development Block Grant funds which will become available after January 1, 2024. The public hearing will be held at 7:00 PM on August 10, 2023, at Edmundson City Hall, 4440 Holman Lane, Edmundson, MO. 63134.

To further its commitment to fair and equitable treatment of all citizens, the City of Edmundson has enacted and/or enforces the following:

A Fair Housing Ordinance prohibiting unlawful discrimination against any person because of race, sex, color, religion, disability, familial status or national origin;

A Policy of Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Disability in the admission or access to, or employment in, its federally assisted programs or activities;

A Policy of Equal Opportunity to Participate in Municipal Programs and Services regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, familial status, national origin, or political affiliation;

A requirement for bidding on CDBG activities that promotes employment opportunities created by HUD funding and that these opportunities be afforded low-income community residents and businesses.

If you would like information regarding the above policies or if you believe you have been unlawfully discriminated against, contact the following municipal official or employee who has been designated to coordinate compliance with equal employment opportunity requirements referenced above. Additionally, if you are unable to attend the public hearing, you may provide written comments regarding the Community Development Block Grant Program to the following municipal official no later than August 3, 2023:
