Last year at this time I was informing you that the work on the new Public Works building and the renovation of the Police Department building had begun with the ground breaking for the PW building. As those projects draw close to completion, I want to inform you of another project that has been in the works for over four years now, and is now ready to move out of the planning stage into the physical construction stage. On or about April 1st work will begin on the last phase of the streets and sidewalk project. This construction is scheduled to be completed sometime around the end of July. There will be some inconvenience to traffic during this period. Again, as with the other phases, I am encouraging everyone to be patient and plan ahead to avoid the inconveniences. The work will begin at the north end of Edmundson Road and proceed south to the edge of our city limits. Spencer Construction has vowed to not interrupt traffic any more than necessary.

It is always important to vote, and our municipal elections will be held on April 2<sup>nd</sup> this year. Beyond electing your aldermen, MSD has a couple of propositions (S and W) on the ballot concerning rates and how they will finance their projects. I have an e=mail explaining both propositions along with a list of in person meetings that you can attend to question and get clarification, plus a couple of virtual (Zoom) meetings. Remember, the vote is on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, and these meetings start on March 19<sup>th</sup>. As voters, it is wise to be as well informed as possible.

I want to remind you to be sure to register your children at city hall and get their ID bracelet ahead of time. The sooner the better.
